NOTICE OF RATE INCREASE REGARDING WATER & SEWER RATES

Dear Town of Morrison Utility Customer,

This letter serves as a notice to inform you of the upcoming rate increase for water and sewer services that will begin in February 2026. The Town of Morrison has not increased water and sewer rates since 2014, and current rates are well below market levels. Water and sewer rate increases are necessary to fund the maintenance, repair, and replacement of aging infrastructure, as well as to cover rising operational expenses. To help promote conservation efforts, the Town of

Morrison is adjusting its water volume tier structure for customers.

Currently, the usage structure is broken into three Tiers. In addition to new per-gallon Tier thresholds, a fourth Tier will be added to the usage structure. The way the new rates are structured encourages customers to be more mindful of their water use and encourages conservation throughout the year.

2026 Rates are effective beginning February 27, 2026.

TOWN BOARD MEETING MATERIALS



We are better together; here's how you can stay in the loop:

The Town Board meets at 5:00 pm on the first and third Tuesday of each month in the Town Hall at 110 Stone Street. The public is welcome; you can attend in person or via Zoom. A Zoom link for each meeting is on the top of the Agenda page. Board agendas and materials, aka “packets” are published by Friday afternoon before each meeting. You can view them in just three clicks on the Town website.

2.) Click on “Town Board Agendas and Minutes”.

Access Monthly Hogbacks Using Our Notify Me Website Feature

We will soon be switching up how residents can access our monthly Hogback Newsletter. Instead of our monthly email blast, you can now sign up through our website to receive notifications when a new issue is uploaded.

You will first need to have an account. You can create a new account in a few easy steps by clicking the “Website Sign In” button located at the top right corner of our website home page. Once directed to the next page, click the “Sign up” link and it will walk you through the next steps.

Once you have set up your new account, you can sign up for notifications in 2 simple steps.

1.) From our website home page, hover over the “How Do I?” tab and select E-Notifications under “Register For”



INFANT STEGOSAURUS VS. PEDRO



How big is an infant Stegosaurus? The evidence is in the Morrison Jurassic fossil record. In 2007, Matthew T. Mossbrucker spotted a tiny rear foot track in one of the boulders curated from Quarry 5 at Dinosaur Ridge. When compared to Pedro's rear paw, the size is just about the same.

Paleontologists can use the size of the rear paw track to estimate the size of the hatchling, which is about six pounds. This is one pound less than Pedro. It is fun to imagine chihuahua-sized Stegosaurus hatchlings growing up in what would become Morrison, CO.



You can see the infant Stegosaurus track for yourself at the Morrison Natural History Museum. You can also see a model 6-pound Stegosaurus.

VOLUNTEER CREW PROVIDES ESSENTIAL MUSEUM SUPPORT





We love our volunteers! This February, we hosted a Volunteer Appreciation Night to celebrate our volunteers and highlight achievements of those who got certified in specialized roles here at the museum. In 2025, a total of 60 individual volunteers donated 6,874 service. This total number of hours equates to 3.3 Full Time Employees (FTEs), basically doubling our staffing hours. The value of this time is \$239,146.46*, which is close to the Town's 2026 budget allocation for paid Museum staff salary and wages. Volunteers assist with programming, museum stewardship, groundskeeping, field work, outreach, and exhibits.
